

Anticipating Social Impacts of Climate Change

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's **2021 Climate Impacts Assessment**, released in early May, predicts higher temperature and more extreme heat and rainfall events by 2050. These changes would bring substantial consequences for the health and safety of people statewide, as well as for Pennsylvania's economy, agriculture, and ecosystems.



Notably, this was the first Pennsylvania Climate Impacts Assessment to specifically address issues of Environmental Justice and equity. The report found that climate change will not affect all Pennsylvanians equally. It proposes that as the state works to adapt to climate risks, inequities should be addressed, and measures be taken to ensure efforts do not inadvertently exacerbate existing inequities.



As sobering as the forecast is, it assumes a future in which no action is taken to address the threat of climate change. PA Explores Carbon Capture, Utilization & Storage

Pennsylvania is moving forward on investments in Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage (CCUS) as part of its plan to comprehensively address climate change.

CCUS removes CO2 emissions at the source, before they have the chance to enter the atmosphere and cause warming effects. Once captured, CO2 can be transported via pipeline to a storage site.

Elk State Forest: From Rivers to Ridges






